Plants Poisonous or Harmful to Horses in the North Central ...

However, when feed is short, or horses are hungry, plants normally avoided become a tempting source of feed, thus a potential poisoning problem When a horse goes off feed, loses weight, colics, or appears unhealthy, poisonous plants may be the cause Poisonous plants contain toxic compounds which can injure horses or kill, even in small doses
